



Skid Steer Operation Safety Tips For the Employer

- 1. The Employer must establish qualified operators for Skid Steer operations.
- 2. The Employer must insure that all operators of Skid steer equipment are trained in the safe methods of skid steer operation as specified by the manufacturer.
- 3. Company approved qualified operators must perform pre-operation inspections of skid steer loaders and document results. Those results must be maintained by the employer in the equipment maintenance history.
- 4. No employee is to operate Skid steer equipment until they have been properly trained and authorized by the employer.
- 5. The Employer must maintain skid steer equipment in accordance with manufacturer requirements.
- 6. The Employer must maintain all safety devices such as Lift arm Supports, Interlocked Controls, Seatbelts, ROPS, and Horn in working order.
- 7. The Employer should monitor operation of equipment by employees and enforce established safe work practices.
- 8. The Employer shall not make modifications or additions that affect capacity or safe operation of the skid steer equipment.
- 9. Employer must survey work area and clearly mark hazards such as open floor holes or surfaces unable to support equipment.
- 10. Employer must select and provide employees with appropriate personal protective equipment, and train them on its use and limitations.
